Important Deadlines:

- Viewgraphs, abstract (100-200 words, NOT a bullet list), speaker bio (100-200 words, NOT a bullet list) and speaker contact information (phone and email) are due 2025 October 3. Viewgraphs need not be the final version but need to be closely representative of the final version. **(Authors should submit their work well before this deadline to increase the likelihood of acceptance. Scheduling of qualified papers is on a first-come/first-served basis.)**
- Notification of acceptance by 2025 October 16 (or much earlier if material is submitted well before deadline).
- Presentation at symposium on 2025 November 6. Please arrive at noon so that you can enjoy the complimentary lunch.
